The Beezantium Plant List

All the plants in our feature garden are mixed
British native plants with some of our favourite hardy annuals,
perennials and bulbs to ensure there is a mixture of nectar
and pollen for bees throughout the year.



Daucus carota 'Purple Kisses'

A cultivar of the straight species hardy annual. Native UK species.



Silene dioica

A short lived wildflower, bearing delicate pink flowers. UK native perennial.



Cosmos 'Purity'

Half hardy annual. Beautiful large open white flowers. Attractive to wildlife.



Nigella damascena

Annual, cottage plant. Grown in the UK since 1500's.



Orlaya grandiflora

Annual umbelliferous species with white flowers.



Echium vulgare

Biannual species. Native to the UK. Attracts a wide range of insects including bees.



Digitalis purpurea 'Camelot Cream'

A biennial treated as an annual. A cultivar of UK native species.



Centaurea nigra

UK native thistle which attracts large numbers of native insects including bees.



Anthriscus sylvestris 'Ravenswing'

A cultivar of the UK native. Purple foliage.



Sanguisorba officinalis 'Tanna'

Spires of dark red blooms above crimped, blue-grey foliage.



Nepeta x faassenii 'Junior Walker'

Silvery aromatic foliage, with nectar filled flowers.



Rosa 'The Lady's Blush'

An extremely freeflowering variety, semi-double cups of a pure mid pink.



Achillea millefolium

UK native which has flat heads of white flowers.



Rosa 'Francis E.Lester'

Dark green foliage & pink buds opening to single, white flowers.



Alchemilla mollis

Perennial. Palmately lobed basal leaves & sprays of tiny, yellow or greenish flowers.



Allium hollandicum 'Purple Sensation'

Great bulb for bees & other insects.
Organically grown.



Erigeron karvinskianus 'Profusion'

Daisy flowers, flowers range from white to pink.



Allium basalticum 'Silver Spring'

White star shaped flowers with purple centres. Organically grown.



Verbascum x hybrida 'Southern Charm'

Tall herbaceous plant with flowers the colour café-au-lait
