The George at Castle Cary

'The George is at the heart of the Castle Cary community, and we're excited to build on the brilliant work of the current team. From the beginning of 2026, the estate will embark on a restoration of the building and its interiors to preserve this much-loved community landmark.

Sustainability

We have always been committed to operating sustainably, reducing waste and being mindful. By prioritising people, land and the planet we hope to minimise negative impacts and champion the positives. We know we can do more, and we are determined to do so. In focusing our attention on our environmental and human impact we recently kickstarted our approach with the brilliant support of The Good Crowd, a local sustainability agency. Senior team members on the estate were part of a sustainability workshop, led by co-founders Catherine and Natalie, that inspired energy and focus on shaping The Newt's legacy. Although we have a journey ahead of us, there have been some recent changes with reason to be proud.

Wildfarmed

We have made the switch to Wildfarmed flour in our bakery and proudly sell their products in our farm shops. Wildfarmed are industry leaders in regenerative farming in the UK. By working closely with their growers and focusing on soil health they are on track to start transforming our food system. On their website, co-founder Andy Cato states

"We put soil health first, allowing us to grow tasty, nutritious food in a way that heals the planet. If we can get grasses, trees, and perennial plants of all kinds back into the 'fields of single crops' that cover two-thirds of the country, we can make agriculture a solution to our biodiversity and climate crises rather than a contributor. That's our mission."

Lodge Hill, Castle Cary

Led by Project Manager, Ed White, the final telegraph poles have been removed on Lodge Hill with all power lines now buried underground. This work has been conducted by SSEN, fully funded by ourselves and hopefully, you'll agree that this has only added to the beauty of this beloved town focal point.

Elsewhere on the hill, we have been conducting ground clearance and maintenance work to protect the archaeological features at the castle site under consultation with Historic England. All scrub management has been conducted alongside the guidance of an ecologist.

A359 Bridge, Pitcombe

Our farming operations have reaped the benefits from the bridge installation, connecting the agricultural land at Lodge Hill to Avalon Farm. As part of the delivery, we are also allowing access as a permissive bridleway to link up the popular Monarch's Way route, which currently crosses this busy road. This will be open by the end of November and includes an additional permissive bridleway that takes in the beauty of the ridge leading to Yarlington.

Compost

We already have a robust waste management system on site with zero waste ending in landfill, but we wanted to challenge our food waste processes. As standard our food waste goes to an external biodigester, however in a trial at the Garden Café, the team have now been separating any food waste to use the raw vegetable peels within our on site composting pad. This is in addition to the garden and woodland waste making over 250m3 of compost every year. The trial has proven successful, and this system will now be rolled out across the estate.
